Bridesburg School Mandatory Uniform Policy **GRADES K-8**

Please be advised that the Board of Education adopted a resolution that requires all schools to implement a uniform policy. We believe that this policy will assist in creating a positive climate where students can focus on learning. The school uniform is as follows:

Boys: Tan khaki pants, worn at the waist. Belts should be worn with a simple buckle.

A plain BLACK golf type shirt (collar with 2-3 buttons).

No T-shirts are allowed. If a student chooses to wear a t-shirt under his or her uniform, it may not extend below the uniform shirt.

Girls: Tan khaki pants, jumper or skirt. Pants or slacks must be **full length**; skirts and jumpers must be **knee length**.

Important: Black stretch pants cannot replace the uniform pants and are not permitted.

Note: On warm weather days, knee-length tan khaki shorts are permitted.

A plain BLACK golf type shirt (collar with 2-3 buttons).

Shoes for Boys and Girls: Rubber soled, dark shoes or black sneakers are required. Open toed shoes are not permitted.

All students:

1) **Gym uniform:** On days when students are scheduled for Physical Education, they are permitted to wear gym attire and sneakers. The uniform consists of black sweat pants, a yellow tee shirt or black school uniform shirt and black shorts (weather permitting).

2) **Hooded sweatshirts (hoodies) are not permitted.**

3) Large, overly ornate jewelry is not permitted. Hats and other headwear are prohibited in the school building (**Except for religious purposes**).

4) Students are not permitted to bring purses or handbags to school.

If a student does not adhere to the uniform policy, an adult will be contacted to bring an appropriate change of clothes for the student.

Students who repeatedly violate the uniform policy will be subject to other sanctions, including but not limited to loss of trip privileges and exclusion from other special school activities.
