The Bridesburg School-Parent Compact is in effect during the 2023-2024 school year. - 1. 50% or more students in grades 3 through 8 will score Proficient or Advanced on the PSSA ELA Assessment.*
- 2. 52% or more students in grade 3 will score Proficient or Advanced on the PSSA ELA Assessment.*
- 3. 30% or more students in grades 3 through 8 will score Proficient or Advanced on the PSSA Math Assessment.*
- 4. 67% or more students will attend school 90% or more school days.*
- 5. 98% or more students will have zero out-of-school suspensions.*

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Bridesburg Elementary will:

Bridesburg School staff will continue to utilize data to inform instruction and collaborate with other educators to provide high-quality learning experiences in a supportive learning environment that enables every student to meet the state's academic achievement standards.
Hold parent-teacher conferences three times during the year to give parents the opportunity to monitor their child's progress and gain strategies for supporting student learning at home.
Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's academic progress, including interim reports during each marking period and report card conferences.
Provide parents with reasonable access to staff.
Provide parents with opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's education.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

Do our best to ensure our children attend school on time every day, when they are healthy.
Stay aware of homework and other assignments and encourage students to complete these academic assignments and projects at home.
Monitor our children's use of technology and require responsible use of social media.
Monitor and set boundaries around our children's use of video and online games.
Volunteer in my child's classroom, after receiving the necessary background checks.
Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education.
Promote the positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading all school and District communications and responding, as needed.
Try to attend SAC and Home & School Meetings to stay informed and participate in school improvement.

Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.

COMMUNICATION ABOUT STUDENT LEARNING:

Bridesburg Elementary is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

All communication will be sent in parent-friendly language. Translations into languages spoken at home are available in partnership with the School District's Family and Community Engagement office.
Automated Messages will be sent to all parents registered in the Student Information System (SIS) regarding events, announcements, and other information.
Monthly calendars will be provided as a method of communication identifying events scheduled for the month.
Conferences will be held every marking period to address teacher and parental concerns on a student's academic achievement.
Emails to parents will go out on an as needed basis to help in communication.
Class Dojo will be utilized by classroom teachers to give feedback on assignments and progress.
Weekly communication folders (K-5) or student planners (6-8) will include any necessary information for parents.
Text messages with informational alerts will be sent periodically, as needed.
